Northumberland – The Northumberland National Bank and The Daily Item will support local schools in the sponsorship of The Northumberland National Bank/The Daily Item Stock Market Challenge from the Pennsylvania Council on Financial Literacy (PennCFL). All Public and Private schools are invited to participate from Snyder, Union, Montour, and a broad area of Northumberland County. The sponsorship will include all the 3rd to 12th grade students for *both* the fall and spring games, for all divisions – elementary, middle and high schools. The Fall Game concluded in December. The Spring Game starts Feb. 10th 2020.

For the spring game, an extra special competition will be held for high and middle school students. These students will represent their schools in local and competitive, investment competition. The schools invited to participate are Selinsgrove, Midd-West, Lewisburg, Mifflinburg, Danville, Milton, Shikellamy, and Warrior Run. A celebration luncheon will be hosted by Susquehanna University on May 21st to honor the schools, teachers and their students. They will be honored by bank and newspaper executives along with PennCFL staff.
